  - Disclaimer: Neighborhood statistics don't include incidents involving domestic violence, juveniles, or sexual assault
  - Neighborhood Stats (July 1 – August 17)
    - 11 Fireworks calls over July 4<sup>th</sup> weekend
    - 3 Vehicle Buglaries
      - 1 Vehicle unlocked – gun, wallet, knife stolen
      - 2 Vehicles locked – no damage to doors or windows, cash/wallets stolen

- Guest Speaker: David Flintom, Director of the Mayor's Action Center
  - SeeClickFix St. Pete
    - In use since 2014, City receives an average of 2,500-3000 reports monthly
      - 26% Codes
      - 18% Sanitation
    - Access through StPete.org ([Report an Issue](#)) or the SeeClickFix app
    - Magnolia: 2,132 reports since 2014 (35% Codes, 26% Sanitation)
  - DOs and DON'Ts:
    - DON'T report law enforcement issues (contact SPPD directly)
    - DON'T report utility issues, like electric lines/poles that are maintained by Duke Energy
    - DON'T post reports that can't be fixed (general comments, opinions, items for sale, etc)
    - DON'T harass neighbors or otherwise violate their Terms of Service
    - DO always provide an address or specific location description

- DO attach a photo
  - DO post a new issue report for each address
  - DO post different issues with the appropriate category (i.e. Codes vs Sanitation)
  - DO be respectful of others
- New: No Anonymous Codes Reports
  - Law passed by Florida Legislature, effective July 1, 2021
  - Complainants must give full first & last name and physical address
  - Complainant information becomes part of the public record
  - Issues reported in July dropped approx. 40%
- During active hurricanes, issue categories are updated to allow for faster reporting (tree down, flooding, etc)
